CHAPTER V

CONCLUSIONS, IMPLICATIONS, AND SUGGESTIONS

5.1 Conclusions

- 1. All Conversational Maxims such as the maxims of quantity, quality, manner and relevance occur in Kick Andy Talk Show Program, but with the exception of Lanjar case where there is no occurance of maxims of quality in his statements.
- Each episode has different phenomenon due to the maxims which are obeyed and violated and the way of the interview obeying or violating the maxims.
- 3. The reason of obedience of conversational maxims is the interviewces still answer the question in corridor. The reason of the violation of conversational maxims is because of the topics that raised by the interviewer. They influenced the way of thinking and exploring the answers of the interviewees.

5.2 Implications

- Obeying the conversational maxims in conversation is important for creating an effective communication
- Violating the conversational maxims can be the one of barriers in exchanging information in communication

 The choice of conversation topics influence the way speakers and hearers in delivering their statements.

5.3 Suggestions

- 1. In certain situation, people will face the difficulty to speak briefly and communicate each other in intended purpose. Sometimes, people will fail to eatch the intention of their partner in conversation. It is suggested that in exchanging information, people should be aware of catching the signal of the speaker and try to speak in the corridor that the speaker needs from the listener.
- 2. to the interviewees, it is suggested to catch the signal of the interviewer by correlating the question with the precise answer. To the interviewer, it is suggested to raise the topic that is not contained of private matter and confusing questions.
- 3. to other researchers who are interested in conversational maxims, it is suggested to conduct a research on other field of observation, for example drama script and novel. Since it is rarely seen that the conversational maxims in written conversation observed.
