On-Line Teaching and Learning in Primary Mathematics: Professional Development Program for South East Asian Teachers

Ida Karnasih, Teoh Boon Tat, and Michael Liau Tet Loke

In-line teaching and learning in mathematics education in primary school have emerged as major issues for consideration in this part of the world. Technology in its myriad proposals and applications must of necessity be developed satisfactorily and sufficiently to be of use to mankind. It is imperative that primary chools and institutions be aware of what is happening and be able to immerse themselves completely in search and change. The use of on-line learning is important in many areas. Such needs and thriffications have been spelt out precisely and pragmatically as the surfacing options to be addressed tobally.
