CHAPTER V CONCLUSIONS AND SUGGESTIONS

A. Conclusions

After the data has been analyzed, it can be concluded as the following:

- 1. There are four types of Speech Act uttered by Jay Gatsby in The Great Gatsby Movie. The total number of utterances are 217 utterances. The precentages of those Speech Act are commisives (13%), representatives (39%), directives (31%), expressives (17%).
- 2. The dominant type of Speech Act Uttered by Jay Gatsby in The Great Gatsby Movie is Representatives (39%).
- 3. The implication of the dominant type uterred is that Gatsby's previous life who was from a very poor family and dreaming to be rich and also how his love left him because of his poverty is the main reason why he boasts everything he has. He doesn't want to be looked down by other people so he shows off everything that he has to keep his pride high

B. Suggestions

Related to the conclusion above, the suggestion which are useful for the reader are the following; theoretically, the result of this study is expected to contribute on the development of pragmatic study, especially on how to analyze text using the speech act theory.

Practically, the result of this research is expected to be useful:

- For Student of English Department. It is expected that the students obtain more information about Speech Act, especially Speech Act of action based on appropriate situational context.
- 2. For readers, this research will give information and enrich their knowledge about Speech Act and how Speech Act used in the daily communication.
