CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

A. Conclusion

Based on the research findings found after analyzing the positive politeness strategies used by Angkolanese, the conclusion drew as follow:

- Angkolanese in Tanobato applied 10 strategies of positive politeness strategies, such as: 1.) Use in-group identity markers, 2.)
 Seek Agreement, 3.) Avoid Disagreement, 4.) Notice/attend hearer's wants, 5.) Joke, 6.) Offer/promise, 7.) Include S and H in the activity, 8.) Give gifts to Hearer, 9.) Exaggerate and 10.) Give (or ask) for reasons.
- 2. Angkolanese in Tanobato realized their positive politeness by using most three dominant strategies, they are: 1.) Using the third person pronoun to refer to the hearer (you) to convey group membership and using address/kinship, 2.) Using repetition for stress the seeking agreement and 3.) Adding or convincing information to avoid disagreement statement.

The Angkolanese in Tanobato used positive politeness strategies to teach and educate the younger how to use better language as their identity markers, build the familiarity and make a good relationship by using a strategy of seeking agreement, and reduce conflict and to keep harmonious by using a strategy of avoiding disagreement.

B. Suggestion

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After did research in the field, and obtained the data and information in accordance with the required to research purpose, the researcher would like to give suggestion and hopefully can be useful for the development of thinking for the continuity of a process of unity and the nation. The suggestions were mention below:

- 1. Suggested for further research to do research about politeness strategies in different data sources.
- 2. Suggested for the young generation to apply the positive politeness in conversation.
- Suggested for the readers to gain their knowledge about positive politeness and Batak Angkola culture.
