CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

5.1 Conclusion

After accomplishing all of the processes in this research, such as choosing the research, developing the concept, gathering references, and collecting and analyzing the data, the researcher reached a conclusion on the illocutionary acts found in the interview between Miss Universe and Puteri Indonesia.

- Illocutionary acts is classifying into five categories, and they are found in the interview as many as 36 utterances, which are representatives found 15 acts (41.6%) such as telling, claiming, informing, correcting, and asserting. For expressions found 9 acts (25.1%) such as greeting, happy, and praise. For directives found 8 acts (22.2%) such as give advice, questioning, suggestion, and request. Commissives found 3 acts (8.3%) such as promise, and offering, and lastly only 1 act for declarations (2.8%).
- 2. The reason of usage illocutionary acts in the interview between Miss Universe and Puteri Indonesia is due to the fact that there are four types of general principles (maxim principles): maxim of quantity (30.6%), maxim of quality (25%), maxim of relation (25%), and maxim of manner (19.4%). These principles focus on ensuring that the information conveyed by the two speakers is accurate based on facts and experiences shared by both speakers.

5.2 Suggestion

Based on the conclusion, the researcher proposes the suggestion that may beuseful in conducting additional research on illocutionary acts.

- 1. The study of illocutionary acts on Instagram live interview between Miss Universe and Puteri Indonesia is one of the speech acts that must be understood because it can occur anywhere, and the main thing in categorizing illocutionary acts is to have information that includes general principles or maxim principles for accurate information.
- 2. The study of illocutionary acts can be used as a reference to expand one's knowledge, especially, determine data information that includes four reasons from the maxim principles, so that there is no violation in the interview conversation. This study is useful for anyone who conduct further research about illocutionary acts.
