## **CHAPTER V**

## **CONCLUSIONS AND SUGGESTIONS**

## A. Conclusions

Having analyzed the types of Process in Editorial of *The Jakarta Post*, the conclusions are drawn as the following:

- 1) There are five types of Process found in Editorial of *The Jakarta Post* on political topic with the total number of Process were 402 in 402 clauses. The type of Process namely Material Process (62.18%) from 250 clauses, then followed Relational Process (26.86%) from 108 clauses, Verbal Process (5.72%) from 23 clauses, Mental Process (3.23%) from 13 clauses, and the last is Existential Process (1.99%) from 8 clauses. While Behavioral Process did not occur in Editorial of *The Jakarta Post* on political topic.
- 2) The dominant Process which is used in editorial of *The Jakarta Post* on political topics was Material Process with the total numbers and percentage was 250 (62.18%).
- 3) Editorial, in delivering its topic tells about the event(s) including activity, space and time. Material Process was the dominant one because it indicates activities or events that happen in the outside world of human being. Furthermore, for the editorial of *The Jakarta Post* presented a

report of an action, so the physical or action verbs are mostly used as the representation of the physical experience of human being.

## **B.** Suggestions

In relation to the conclusion, the following suggestions are offered.

- 1) Teacher are suggested to introduce the types of Process as element of representing message by using media such as newspaper or other sources.
- 2) Students of Applied Linguistics who learn Functional Grammar should be able to comprehend the types of Process whether it is applied in different kinds of text. So they will be able to know and get what messages are truly implied in editorial or other sources.
- 3) Other researcher who are interest in conducting a more in-depth analysis on transitivity especially Process to do further research or analysis by applying the whole aspect of Systemic Functional Linguistics.
