This study deals with women's language analysis on the main character in Jane Austen's novel: *Pride and Prejudice*. The objectives of the study are to describe the types of women's linguistics features on the main character in Jane Austen's novel *Pride and Prejudice*, to derive women's linguistics features on the main character in Jane Austen's novel *Pride and Prejudice*, to reason women's linguistics features on the main character in Jane Austen's novel *Pride and Prejudice*. The research was conducted by descriptive qualitative. The data are the speech on the main character in Jane Austen's novel, the data were collected from 1 novel, *Pride and Prejudice* that has women's linguistics features. The data were analyzed by identifying and classifying the figures of speech displaying the result in a table. Then these linguistics features are described in details. The analysis found that there are 9 types of women's linguistics features which used: lexical hedges is amount 10,06%, tag question is 0,62%, rising intonation on declarative is 2,51%, empty adjective is 3,14%, precise color terms is 0%, intensifier is 56,60%, hyper correct grammar is 1,88%, super polite form is 0,62%, avoidance of swear word is 14,46%, and emphatic stress is 10,06%. The most dominant feature that used is intensifier and the lowest is precise color terms because it is not used in the data
