

## CHAPTER FIVE

### CONCLUSIONS AND SUGGESTIONS

#### 5.1 Conclusions

Having analyzed the data, conclusions are drawn as the following:

- 1). There are 43 types of Speech Functions used in political articles in the *Newsweek*. They are teasing, blaming, statement, asserting, refusal/ refusing, warning, suggestion, arguing, undertaking, assuring, disclosing, promising, accepting, complaining, contradicting, doubting, wondering, comparing, reporting, question, predicting, concluding, responding, stating, implying, recommending, summarizing, elliptic question, respond statement question, assenting, conditioning, reassuring, proclaiming, encouraging, claiming, fearing, instructing, praising, trusting, hinting, advising, discouraging, and respond statement disclosing.
- 2). Speech Functions are interrelated in the system of network through roles and commodity. Where role can be divided into two types, they are giving and demanding, and commodity can be divided into two types, they are information and goods & services.
- 3). Speech Functions are used to fulfill human needs in exchange of experience which is oriented to functional interpretation or systematic functional.
- 4). The most dominant of Speech Functions and Mood used is statement and declarative.

## 5.2 Suggestions

With reference to the conclusions, suggestions are staged as the following:

- 1). The findings of this study can be used to fulfill a better understanding for the readers of the *Newsweek* magazine.
- 2). It is suggested for other researchers to make a detailed analysis of the Speech Functions in *Newsweek* magazine to fulfill human needs in exchange of experience which is oriented to functional interpretation or systematic functional.
- 3). Language in *Newsweek* magazine is greatly influenced by the mission or voice of the Politician, so it is suggested for the writer to propose a balance information to certain social issue.
- 4). Political articles can be used as an exchange of experience by human beings. It means that exchanged of experience is known as Interpersonal Functions which can guide the readers to understand what the writer means in her/his writing.
- 5). It is suggested to master Interpersonal Functions in making interaction because there are various settings to explain roles, information and goods and services.
