

CHAPTER V CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

5.1 Conclusions

The conclusion that can be drawn from the data analysis and findings in this study about Lexical Words in the Speech Production of Broca Aphasia Patients can be described as follows:

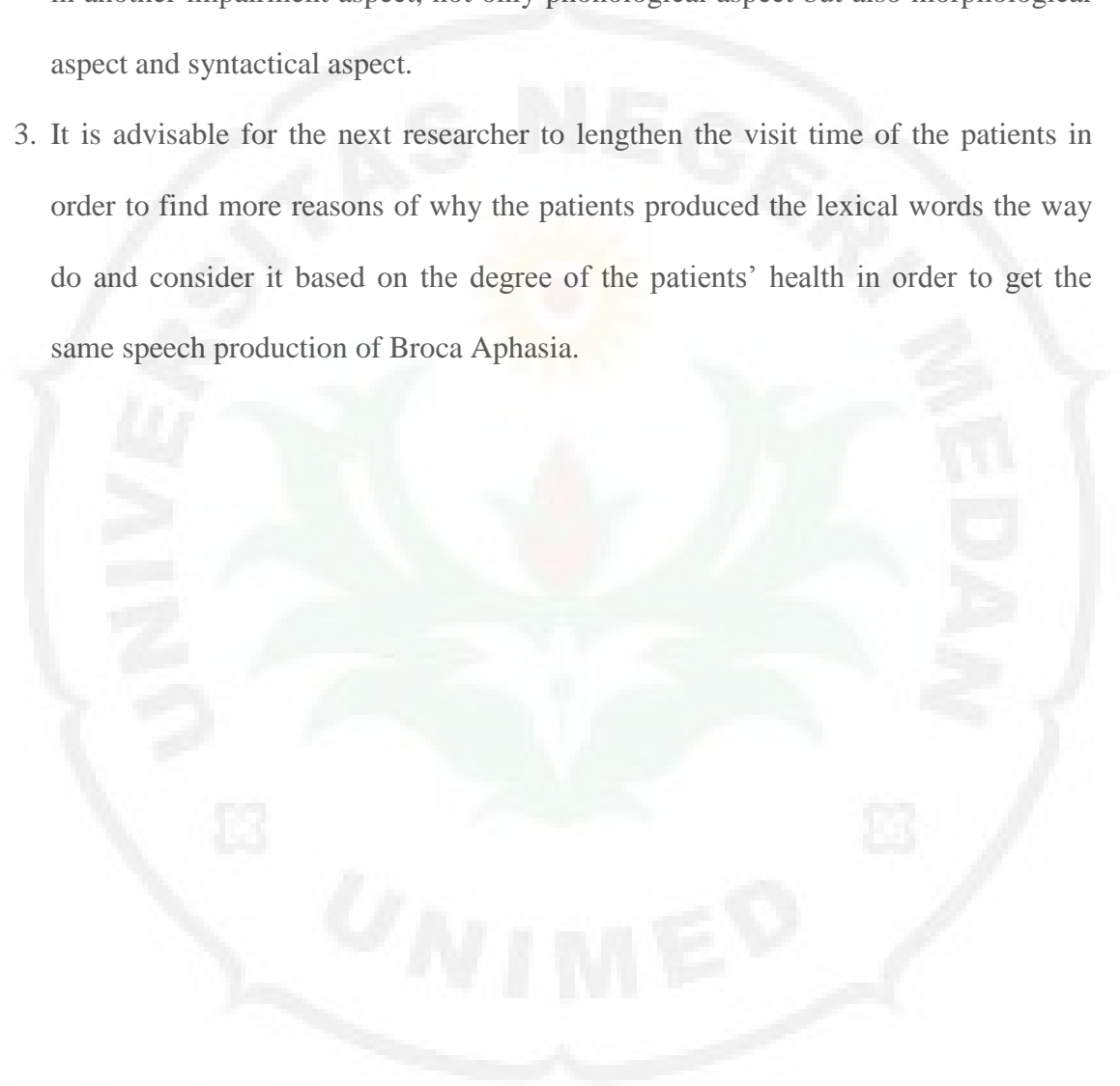
1. Broca Aphasia patients produced all kinds of lexical words in their speech production. The verbs were mostly produced by the patients. But the impaired words were produced on noun mostly.
2. Addition, omission, movement and substitution were processes which were found in the Broca Aphasia patients' speech production. In which the additional process was not found on verb. But for omission process were found in all kinds of lexical words. Substitution process was only not found on adverbs. While movement process was only found on noun.
3. Four reasons of Broca Aphasia Patients produced lexical words were found in their speech the way they do. First, they were difficult to produce some phonemes both vowels and consonants. The second, they were difficult to find words (word-finding difficulties). The third is the ability to repeat was impaired. Last, discussing the emotional topics.

5.2 Suggestions

In line with the conclusions, suggestions are staged as the following:

1. It is suggested that further studies should be conducted to find out more data about the kinds of lexical words with more subjects.

2. It is suggested that further research should be conducted to find out more processes in another impairment aspect, not only phonological aspect but also morphological aspect and syntactical aspect.
3. It is advisable for the next researcher to lengthen the visit time of the patients in order to find more reasons of why the patients produced the lexical words the way do and consider it based on the degree of the patients' health in order to get the same speech production of Broca Aphasia.



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
