CHAPTER V

5.1 Conclusion

The study reveals three types of themes: Topical (Unmarked Theme, Mraked theme), Textual (Continuatives, Conjunctive Adjunct and Directive Particles), and Interpersonal (Modal / Comment Adjunct, Vocatives, and Finite Verbal Operator). Morphology is also studied, enabling learners to understand word structure and imitate it. Morphological awareness is crucial for improving vocabulary and recognizing meanings.

The umpasa is used to show blessings, respecting, praising, advising, thanking, agreeing, expecting, opening, and closing. Hula - hula has an important role in the implementation of marriage. Umpasa plays a significant role in

traditional Batak wedding ceremonies, particularly among the Batak people of North Sumatra, Indonesia. Here's a brief overview of its functions:

- a. **Blessings and Good Wishes**: Umpasa consists of poetic expressions, proverbs, and well-wishes delivered by elders or designated individuals during different stages of the wedding ceremony. These are meant to invoke blessings upon the couple, ensuring their happiness, prosperity, and longevity in marriage.
- b. **Cultural Preservation**: Umpasa serves to uphold and transmit cultural values, beliefs, and norms from one generation to the next. It reinforces the importance of tradition and community in Batak society.

InToba Batak custom, one of them is to giving ulos to the bride and groom and their families. The benefits of ulos provided by hula - hula to boru namely Ulos given by hula - hula is a sign of love love for Boru which serves to protect Boru and when giving the ulos, hula - hula conveys it with accompanied by rhymes that have certain meanings so mangulosi means hula - hula giving bowls to bored hope horas jala gabe. Finally, Hula - hula plays a very important role in the implementation of customs from the start until the end of a marriage custom. Without the presence of hula—hula at a wedding party then the party does not take place well. So to end a hula wedding party—hula also plays a very important role, meaning before the party is over, hula—hula must not leave the party.

The research involved using the semantic and lexicogrammatical resources of the System of Transitivity, Mood, Theme, and Information Value framework to cover a set of ideational and textual meanings in the umpasa of the Batak Toba Wedding Ceremony. Based on the semogenic principle, holdings of the rite can be recorded in written texts and here umpasa. Although it is intricate to describe interpersonal or symbolic meanings in umpasa, in the Batak Toba Wedding Ceremonial as an example, they significantly indicate delineation and boundaries between processes, functions, participants, roles, activities, stages of the rite, and features that the celebrants want in their alliances. Thus, certain semogenic features highlight linguistic and textual characteristics, particularly verbs or the nominalization process, transitivity, and the projection of roles functionalized by

actors and participants. The study is expected to be insightful research and the creation of more exemplars. Umpasa, in any other similar rite, can still apply systemic functional linguistics to make a descriptive and more extensive arrangement system.

Secondly, reflective meaning is also applied in the Umpasa of the Batak Toba wedding ceremony. The messages from the Umpasa are explained by the ritualist to those present. It contains explanatory information about the religious meaning, answers questions, expresses gratitude, makes promises, raises consciousness of the present, and invites and influences the internal feelings and desires of those present.

Thirdly, socio-logical meaning is present in the Umpasa of the Batak Toba wedding ceremony. The messages reflect inequality and unity related to lines and roles. The messages have to be authentic and combined with various Batak Toba cultural norms.

The meanings of the Umpasa of the Batak Toba wedding ceremony play an important role. They carry various important phases within them. These meanings are symbols of a higher belief, where humans need the power of the Divine that surrounds and watches over them. The new life journey is promised to continue, and the religiosity of Batak Toba is also shown in this religious meaning. It is a promise that in their next lives, the two prospective wedding couples will exist as descendants of the U form. The messages from the Umpasa indicate accepting a feeling of God in all parts of life. Umpasa is an important part of the Toba Batak traditional wedding ceremony. Umpasa is a form of poetry or rhyme
