CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTIONS

There are two sections to this chapter namely conclusion and suggestion. Firstly, a summary of the research findings from this study is included in the conclusion. Second, readers-student or further researchers are the target audience for this suggestion.

A. Conclusion

After analyzing domestic violence against women on @indonesiafeminis and @konde.co Instagram posts as the main data in this study, researcher found the following conclusions:

- 1) There are four types of domestic violence used in @indonesiafeminis and @konde.co Instagram posts with the percentage order from the most dominant type to the least type found is as follows: physical (60%), psychological/emotional (55%), sexual (35%), and economic/financial (20%).
- 2) The way domestic violence is portrayed on @indonesiafeminis and @konde.co Instagram posts are in line with the principles of feminist critical discourse analysis by Lazar (2007). The posts demonstrate feminist analytical activism, such as posts that urge intervention or attention to domestic violence cases and question the power dynamics that ignore such violence. The posts also highlight the nature of gender and power dynamics and how language contributes to constructing gender norms and emphasize critical self-awareness as a form of action. All the posts reflected radical

feminism, which is emphasizes efforts to combat gender inequality and push for major sosial change. On the other hand, the posts also include aspects of liberal feminism, such as advocating for legal and policy changes to better protect woman from violence.

B. Suggestion

The researcher acknowledged that this study still had flaws owing to restrictions. Therefore, the researcher provides the following recommendations to readers in order to take a feminist critical discourse analysis approach to domestic violence against women.

- 1. The researcher expects that this research may provide readers with many opinions related to this object of study, especially domestic violence issues.
- 2. Linguists and literature reviewers may utilize this study as a reference when conducting future research on gender issues using feminist critical discourse analysis methodology or other related linguistic methodologies such as critical discourse analysis, multimodal discourse analysis, and so on.
